I work with schools on obtaining J-1s for foreign labor already. I am helping the NE chamber of commerce craft a policy statement to increase immigration options and also create policies that encourage a workforce in NE to grow (childcare, transportation, middle income housing, etc).

Unfunded mandates are out of control and contributing to our tax problems. Legislature needs to take more responsibility in funding these things.
